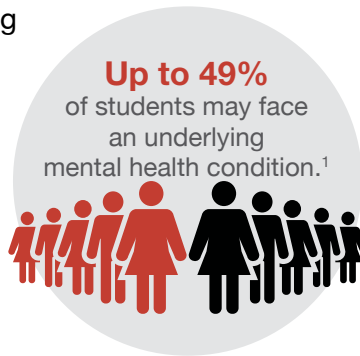
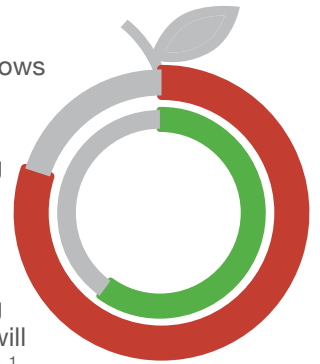


LearnWell Counseling services for districts

At LearnWell, we believe that providing easy access to counseling services for all students with mental health needs is critical to supporting students' success in academics and beyond. However, most students experiencing common mood disorders do not receive treatment due to limited availability of services.



Research shows up to 80% of students experiencing anxiety and 60% of students experiencing depression will go untreated.¹



We provide the following services:

- Psychological evaluations
- Ongoing mental health counseling
- Psychiatric assessments
- Medicine management, when appropriate

Our counseling services are appropriate to support:

- Students who show signs of emerging social/emotional and mental health needs
- Students with anxiety and depression
- Students who require ongoing mental health counseling support

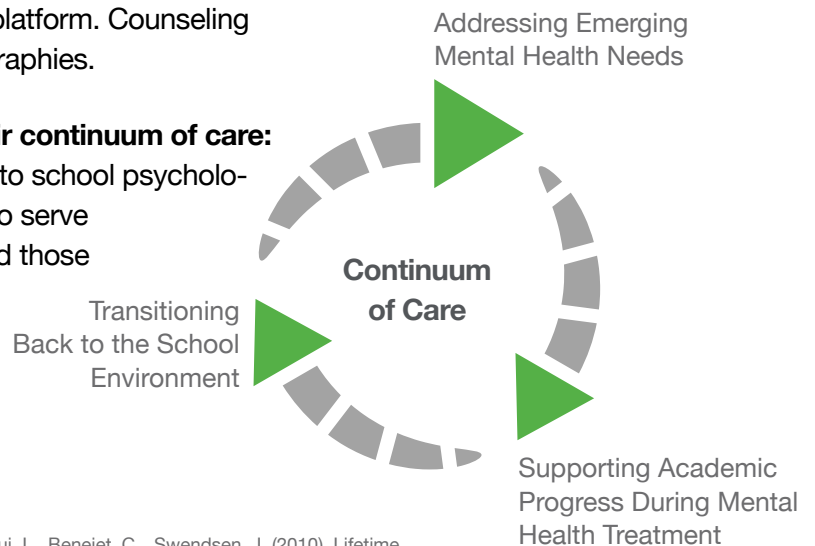
Mental health counseling support for all students

No-cost solution for districts: Clinicians who partner with LearnWell accept Medicaid and most insurance carriers, providing a no-cost solution for school districts and enabling access to most, if not all, students.

Sessions are designed for ease of access and flexibility: Our Virtual Counseling platform provides convenient access to quality mental health care. Traditional barriers to treatment, such as inclement weather, and difficulties with transportation can easily be avoided using our platform. Counseling sessions are available in-person in certain geographies.

LearnWell supports students throughout their continuum of care:

LearnWell Counseling services provide support to school psychologists, social workers and guidance counselors to serve students with emerging mental health needs and those who may require ongoing services after mental health treatment. Additionally, LearnWell provides high quality academic instruction during mental health treatment and tutoring to support students with mental health needs.

The district referral process is simple.

This process can either be completed by the district or the district can refer parents to submit a referral with LearnWell directly.

- 1 District identifies student in need of services
- 2 Parent or district completes LearnWell's online referral form
- 3 LearnWell follows up to schedule initial appointment

Our network of therapists is specialized in treating students. Therapists can offer **verbal therapy, psychological evaluations, and medication management**, when appropriate.

Treatment is available in eight different foreign languages including: Spanish, Italian, Russian, Hebrew, German, Creole, French, and Farsi.

District communication is key to supporting students.

School and district staff will receive ongoing reporting from LearnWell on the following:

- Number of referrals sent to LearnWell
- Number of intakes performed by LearnWell
- Number of students receiving ongoing treatment



We are focused on student data privacy.

Privacy and confidentiality are essential. LearnWell's Virtual Counseling platform is compliant with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), and the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA). We require the district to obtain parental consent before referring students to LearnWell. Information regarding which students are receiving services is made available only if the parent/guardian provides consent to LearnWell to share this information with the district.
